Important: Riders and owners must be NSHJA members prior to first competition to be eligible for awards. Convenience option: add a membership to your NSEF membership renewal.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA RULES AND STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

The 2019 Coveseide Classic competition is sanctioned as a Bronze and Gold competition member of Equestrian Canada (EC), 308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, Ontario, K2K 1Y6 and are governed by the rules of EC (A602.1).

Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location. (A602.6)

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition. (A602.7)

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. (A602.2)

EQUESTRIAN CANADA STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of the horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainers and competitors, or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Requiring owners, trainers and competitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and
- Actively promoting the development and adherence of competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive, nor inhumane.

Concussion Awareness Equestrian Canada Concussion Protocols

Equestrian Canada (EC) is one of the first national governing bodies for sport in Canada to implement official, sport-specific guidelines on return-to-play protocols for athlete concussions. EC's Accidents & Return-to-Play Rule came into effect Jan. 1, 2019.



The 2019 Coveside Classic is proud to be a competition sanctioned by the United States Equestrian Federation. If you intend to enter a division or class sanctioned by the USEF, please take note of these important components of the USEF Rules.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

By signing an Entry Form to enter into USEF rated classes in this competition, you are bound by the following terms and conditions:

USEF Statement and Entry Agreement

1. Every entry at a Licensed Competition constitutes an agreement that the person making it, owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, rider, handler, vaulter, longeur, and the horse are subject to the Bylaws and the rules of the Federation and the local rules of the competition. Exhibitors are cautioned to abide by restrictions concerning exhibiting horses before judges as provided for in GR1304. Participants utilizing an online entry system for a Licensed Competition do so with the agreement that they have read the Official Prize List and agree to follow all the class specifications, requirements and conditions in the Official Prize List.
2. Every exhibitor, rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, coach and trainer or his/her agent(s) must sign an entry blank. In the case of a rider, driver, handler, vaulter or longeur under the age of 18, his/her parent or guardian, or if not available, the trainer, must sign an entry blank on the minor's behalf. Unless specifically provided otherwise by law, any of the above persons may alternatively sign an entry blank in electronic form which shall have the same validity, force and effect as a signature affixed by hand. If any of the above persons fails to do so, his/her first entrance into the ring as an exhibitor, rider, driver, handler, vaulter or longeur shall be construed as his/her acceptance of the rules of the competition involved and of the Federation and shall ipso facto render him/her subject to said rules. Upon the failure of an owner, trainer, rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, coach or agent(s), or parent or guardian or trainer of a minor rider, driver, handler, vaulter or longeur, to sign an entry blank as required, and upon confirmation of any such violation(s) by the steward or secretary of the competition, such person(s) shall be subject to an automatic fine of \$250 imposed for each such violation.
3. Violation of the rules in connection with entries may be cause for disqualification of the exhibitor, rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, coach and trainer by the Directors of the Licensed Competition (see GR1218.4) and for report to the Federation.
4. The Federation, incorporated in 2003, is a New York Not-For-Profit corporation. Pursuant to Chapter 6, the construction and application of Federation rules are subject to the laws of the State of New York. It is expressly agreed by and between the Federation and its members and any other persons in any way participating or in any way seeking to participate in a Licensed Competition or otherwise utilizing or seeking to utilize the privileges or services of the Federation, that any lawsuit (except for an arbitration pursuant to Bylaw 705 of the Federation) brought against the Federation by or on behalf of any such member (whether or not still a member at the time such suit is brought), or by or on behalf of any such person, shall be commenced and adjudicated only in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York or in the Supreme Court of the State of New York, County of New York, to the exclusion of the courts of any other jurisdiction or venue.

ENTRY AGREEMENT (GR906.4) (Read this before signing your Entry Form)

By entering a USEF Federation-licensed Competition and signing an entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of Coveside Stables Limited. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or

the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS

USEF SAFE SPORT TRAINING REQUIREMENT

Starting January 1, 2019, if you are a USEF Competing Member 18 years of age or older you are required to complete the core Safe Sport Training within 30 days of activating your membership.

If you do not complete the training, you are ineligible to participate in all USEF activities including competitions.

2019 COVESIDE CLASSIC RULES AND REGULATIONS

The 2019 Coveside Classic is conducted under the current EC and USEF Rule Books and is approved by NSHJA. Membership cards may be requested at check in and numbers are required on entry forms.

Applicable EC or USEF Rule Book references are sometimes noted but are not a substitute for knowledge of the actual Rule Books. Competitors are expected to know their sport rules.

CLOSING DATE: Closing date for all entries is **August 6, 2019 FIRM.**

For 2019, we strongly encourage you to enter online. **We will not accept scanned or photographed entry forms by email. Online entries receive \$10 discount on admin fee.**

Online payment is available for online entries (Admin, mandatory, and stabling fees are due at entry). Entries not received by August 6, 2019 will be subject to a late fee of \$30 (no exceptions). Entries may not be excepted if the Classic has reached capacity (we typically do reach capacity).

NO HORS CONCOURS ENTRIES. A808

1. Memberships:

- a. All Canadian owners and riders must have a valid EC Gold (or higher) or, for Bronze classes, a Bronze Sport License (A205)-(A207) OR purchase a Single Event Upgrade (A211) or License Transfer (A212) for a Silver or Bronze Sport License to Gold License; OR purchase a Temporary Sport License (A208 – not eligible for points); or be a member in good standing of their own National Equestrian Federation.
- b. Competitors also require provincial territorial sport organization (PTSO) membership.
- c. All athletes and owners must be holders of a current membership in their home country's national federation, and foreign entries must sign an affidavit.
- d. All athletes competing in Amateur classes must possess a valid EC Amateur Card and must present it to the Competition Secretary upon request (A902).
- e. Exception: Lead line riders who require only an NSEF or other PTSO membership.
- f. Please be aware that NSHJA membership is required to participate and/or benefit in the NSHJA Programs.
- g. Please be aware, some classes require only Bronze EC memberships, and some require Gold. If you choose to compete with a Bronze membership in Gold

classes, you must upgrade your membership or purchase a single event upgrade.

2. EC Horse Recordings/FEI Passports

- a. Horse Recordings are mandatory for all horses and ponies entering EC Gold sanctioned competitions. Horses must be entered under the name and with the same owner as appearing on the Horse Recording. (A402) EC sanctioned competitions require the following (where applicable): An active Horse Recording, EC National Passport (with active Horse Recording component) or FEI Passport (with active Horse Recording component). Foreign owned horses may compete with national passports recognized by the FEI. USEF horses may compete with a valid USEF Horse Recording Number. Persons responsible for US or other foreign-owned/leased horses competing in EC-Sanctioned Competitions must complete an affidavit stating that their horse(s) are eligible to compete as entered and must declare the jumper registration number(s) that have been assigned by their respective national federation. If a Horse Recording, an EC National Passport or FEI Passport cannot be produced, the person responsible must complete a Temporary Horse Registration form and pay the temporary registration fee. Results achieved while competing with a Temporary Horse Registration may not be used to qualify for year-end awards, championship competitions, finals or subsequent competitions requiring qualification.

In the case of ponies eight years or over, the owner must enter a statement as to whether the pony is small, medium or large and this must also be signed and dated.

- b. Horse licenses are required for all horses competing in Gold classes.
- c. Horse licenses are not required for horses competing in Bronze classes, however if a competitor wishes to compete in Gold classes they must purchase a temporary horse license or a permanent one.

3. Equine Medication Control and Fees

- a. Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location (A602.6)
- b. All EC-sanctioned competitions are required to collect a prescribed medication control fee for each horse entered. All fees collected are to be remitted using the Equestrian Canada Form to the Equestrian Canada Equine Medications Control Committee or its designate as per the Competition Administration Policy. This fee is to be identified on the entry form as a stand-alone item and not bundled or combined with other fees. (A1008).
- c. Bronze competitors pay \$3.50 and Gold competitors pay \$7.00.

d. The person responsible is the individual responsible and accountable for the care, training, custody and performance of the horse. The person responsible may be the trainer or may be an owner, rider, driver, agent or coach. The person responsible must be an adult and must have an EC individual or group license, with the exception of a Junior Exhibitor parent or guardian (A1011).

e. A fee of \$23 per horse entered in a USEF division is collected and remitted to USEF.

4. Eliminations

The EC “2 Refusal Elimination Rule” in all jumper and equitation classes is followed at Coveside. The competitor has the right to jump a single obstacle after retiring or after being eliminated provided that the obstacle is part of the course of the current competition (this does not apply to elimination resulting from a fall). Falls will result in elimination, rider will not be permitted to remount.

4. Entries

- a. Entries must be received in hand by the Closing Date.
- b. One horse per entry form.
- c. All entries must be completed on an entry form, on line or on official form. (I.e., no phone, email or Facebook entries). All entries must be complete with proper signatures, complete address, membership and passport numbers.
- d. The Show Committee has the right to refuse or limit entries as circumstances warrant. ENTRIES ARE PROCESSED IN ORDER OF DATE/TIME RECEIVED.
- e. Substitution of entries: Will be at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.
- f. Payments: Stabling, mandatory, and administration fees must be paid up front with entry. Entries without payment will not be accepted.
- g. Online entry forms are available at horseshowsonline.com. Online entries are preferred, and therefore paper mailed entries are subject to a \$25 processing fee.

5. Cancellations

a. If cancellations are received in writing prior to noon on August 15, 2019, all entry fees will be refunded less a \$50 office charge. After this date, there will be no refunds unless the owner or rider presents an original veterinarian certificate or medical doctor’s certificate (in the case of the rider) dated within 48 hours of the commencement of the competition. **STALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.**

- b. There will be no refunds except in accordance with this rule.
- c. The person responsible for any horse that does not compete in a class in which it was entered and is not scratched according to these procedures is fully liable for all fees. A816.
- d. After commencement of the competition, class scratches will have no fee if scratched before the first horse competes in the class. After the first horse has competed, there are no refunds.

6. Adds/Scratches/Changes

- a. Class adds, drops (scratches) and class changes are required in writing on an official form, or on-line. In order to be refunded the class fee, scratches are due in the competition office prior to the start of the applicable class. Individual classes may not be added or scratched from a rated division. All adds are to be submitted to the competition office by 5pm the day prior. Please note, a \$20 charge per class will be added for day of adds. We encourage riders/trainers to add the day prior at no charge to allow for more accurate scheduling. Classes ridden with no written add prior to the start of the class will be charged an additional \$20 Rode Not Entered Fee. Day of adds will be based on schedule availability and management approval. There is no guarantee that day of adds will be accepted. As per GR A801.9 Competitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in the completion of their entry forms.
- c. Post entries will go first in all classes of that day.
- d. All scratches must be recorded in the show office. See Rule 5 above.

7. Age – Junior Riders

Individuals are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Juniors’ ages are required to be stated on the entry form, and birth certificates are to be available on request. Riders from the United States qualify as juniors with the United States Equestrian Federation through December 1st of the year they turn 18 years of age. Equestrian Canada Rules (G1006) state:

- Junior A – from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 18

- Junior B – from the beginning of the calendar year in which they turn 13 until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 15
- Junior C – until the end of the calendar year in which they turn 12.

8. Amateur Eligibility

(Article 108) Any person who has ridden on a Senior National Eventing or Jumping Team is not eligible to compete in the amateur division for a period of two years from the date of the last competition at which the athlete rode for the team. Athletes who are on the Jumping Short List for the Canadian Team for the current year are excluded from amateur classes for that year.

7. Payment

- All stabling fees, medication fees, Jump Canada Levy, NSHJA and administration fees must be paid in full prior to the competition. Entry fees may be secured with an open cheque or valid credit card. Prize money will be set off against accounts receivable, unless prior arrangements are made.
- Payment can be made by cash, cheque, email money transfer, or credit card (VISA/MC). Credit card payments are subject to a 3.5% convenience fee.
- Cheques are to be made payable to Coveside Stables. No post-dated cheques.
- A signed, blank cheque or valid credit card is required for open accounts. Open accounts must be approved by Competition Secretary.

8. Returned Cheques

- A \$50 charge will be assessed on all returned cheques.
- Unsettled accounts will be referred to EC, which will result in suspension from all EC competitions.
- Accounts left unpaid will not be permitted to compete at future Coveside competitions until paid in full.

9. Schedule

- The Organizing Committee reserves the right to combine or cancel any class or division with insufficient entries.
- Any class/division with fewer than 4 entries may be combined, cancelled or run with no prize money offered.
- Orders of Go will be posted at the discretion of the OC. First classes of the day will have a posted order of go.
- Sign up orders of go will be offered, however, if competitors, trainers or support staff are not respectful of the time, competition management will create posted orders of go.
- Conflicts: Classes will be held for trainer/coach conflict ONLY if all other trainers/coaches agree. Please prepare accordingly. In Gate has the authority to disqualify an entry for delay deemed to be unreasonable.

f. Management reserves the right to make class and schedule changes at any time.

10. Protective Headgear

- See A905 and G102. At all times, persons mounted at an EC-sanctioned event location must wear approved protective headgear.
- Protective headgear must be certified under one of the following standards: ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials), or SEI (Safety Equipment Institute, Inc.); BSI/BS EN (British Standards Institution); EN (European Union Standards; or AS/NZS (Australian/New Zealand Standards).
- Protective headgear must be properly fitted and securely fastened by a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet.

11. Concussion

Accidents & Return to Play rule: In the event of a fall/accident where a concussion can be reasonably suspected, the competitor must receive medical clearance by qualified medical personnel onsite before continuing to compete. The competitor is solely responsible for ensuring the onsite medical assessment takes place. Should a competitor refuse to be evaluated, they will be disqualified from the competition. If onsite qualified medical personnel suspect a concussion or believe the competitor may be at risk of concussion due to the nature of the fall or impact, the competitor will be suspended from competition and placed on a Medical Suspension List until medically released. Competitors will remain on the EC Medical Suspension List until they submit an EC Return to Play Form, signed by a licensed physician, to EC. No competitor shall compete at EC sanctioned competitions while on the EC Medical Suspension List and competition organizers may refuse entry to anyone currently on the list.

11. Competition Numbers - Schooling Rules

- Numbers must be worn and visible at all times in the schooling and warm-up areas and in the competition ring (A814). Any horse wearing the incorrect number may be eliminated.
- FEI Schooling rules will apply.
- Numbers will be released ONLY when Entry Form is fully complete and payment is secured with the Show Office. A \$25 fee applies to numbers not returned to the Show Office in reusable condition.

12. Attire | Formal

a. Dark, muted or similar colored, or red (scarlet) coats; white or fawn breeches, a white tie, choker (unless the shirt, by design, has the choker built in for its intended use) or hunting stock, and a white or lightly colored shirt. Traditional black or brown boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn. Members of the Armed Services or the police may wear the service dress uniform with

protective headgear. Classes requiring formal attire are the Grand Prix or the Hunter Classic. Riders will be notified by management where exceptions to formal attire are permitted. We ask that you please be sure you are dressed according to the protocol for the class you are entering in. See also G109.

13. Attire | Standard Jumper

Coats are not required. Breeches of any color are permitted. Shirts (polo shirts are permitted) with collars and sleeves (sleeves may be either long or short), tucked into the breeches. Sleeveless shirts and shirts with exposed hoods are not permitted. Traditional black or brown boots are required. Half chaps are permitted if the color matches the paddock boots being worn. All other classes will require standard attire. In extreme weather conditions, the use of jackets, sweaters or raincoats may be approved at management's discretion.

14. Levies

a. **NSHJA:** A fee of \$8.00 per horse entered in the Bronze division for the NSHJA is applicable.

b. **Jump Canada:** A fee of \$20 per horse entered in the Gold competition is applicable and remitted to Equestrian Canada. This is used to support regional and national programs designed to foster the activities of hunter/jumper riders, owners and the industry at large.

15. Combined Hunter Division

Divisions will be combined based on Federation Rules if not filled. One championship will be awarded per combined division.

13. Office Hours

The show office will open 45 minutes before the start of the competition day and will close 30 minutes after the last class of the day. All adds are due by 5:00 p.m.

14. Prizes: Hunter Divisions

a. Placings to 8th place. Ribbons to 8th place unless numbers dictate more or less.

b. Other prizes to be awarded at the discretion of the Organizing Committee

c. See class lists for prize money by class.

15. Payouts

a. Every effort will be made to payout prize money at the end of competition. All prize money not paid at competition will be paid within 30 days of the end of competition after verification that all applicable fees have been paid.

b. Prize money will be credited to accounts.

16. Presentations:

a. Hunter competitors must return to the ring for jog (unless otherwise noted) and presentation dressed appropriately and with horses in a bridle..

b. Jumper competitors must be neat and tidy. Riders should be mounted for presentations.

c. A Victory Gallop may take place for the Mini-Prix and Grand Prix classes. Salute and respect paid to

sponsors in attendance is required. Failure to cooperate may result in forfeiture of prize money.

17. Division Championships

Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in Hunter and Jumper divisions, with a cooler to the Champion. Ties for champion or reserve champion will be decided by the horse that places higher in the over fences portion of the division, or in the case of jumpers by the horse that places higher in the class with the largest prize money. TIES: Article FEI 245 3 - All ties in jumper competitions will be broken on the basis of time in accordance with FEI Rules. In consultation and agreement with the Ground Jury and Organizing Committee, ties will be broken in any jump-off on the basis of time to 100ths of a second. Competitions under Table A, Article 238.2.1 One Round: should there be equality of faults and time after the first round for first place only, there will be one jump-off against the clock. For competition awards, EC points rules apply. For USEF sanctioned divisions, USEF will calculate Championship points for Year End awards using the following USEF system: 1st – 10 points; 2nd – 6 points; 3rd – 4 points; 4th – 2 points; 5th – 1 point; 6th - .5 point.

17. Stabling

a. Stabling is limited and must be reserved on Stall Request Form. YOU MUST INCLUDE SPECIFIC ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE DATES AND TIMES.

b. Bedding is not included in the price of stalls and can be purchased for \$7 per bale. Bedding order and cost must be received with entry. Bedding orders during the competition must be made by 12 noon to ensure same day delivery, and will be charged to rider's account. The invoice is the official record of bedding purchased.

DO NOT HELP YOURSELF TO BEDDING IN STABLING AREA.

c. If you are staying more than 2 nights, you must pay the show rate.

d. Coaches are required to provide one stall list for all horses intended to be stalled together.

e. SHOW PACKAGE: Ship in after 12 p.m. on August 20 to end of competition: - \$200.00

PER DAY: \$45 (available for up to two nights only and subject to availability); you must indicate date and time of arrival of stable reservation form.

f. DAY SHIP-INS: All ship-in horses are subject to a \$25 fee. The fee covers clean up and facility upgrades in ship-in area.

g. In order to manage stable assignments, we need your cooperation. If you are planning on arriving early on the day you compete, we highly recommend that you reserve a stall for the previous night. We are not able to guarantee stall availability for early arrivals.

- f. Special requests to stable near others will be accommodated but not guaranteed.
- g. Stalls are expected to be kept clean during the competition, in accordance with reasonable standards of horsemanship and horse welfare. Participants must comply with instructions of stable management.
- h. Horses must be registered on arrival with stable manager before unloading. Stabling is assigned by stable manager and under no circumstance is a horse to be placed in a stall that is not assigned to it.

18. Pony Measurement

- a. Measurement of ponies will be in the Lower Barn Wednesday at 7:30 a.m.
- b. Horses may be measured randomly.
- c. ARTICLE A1104 TEMPORARY MEASUREMENT FORMS: Until a horse or pony is eight years of age, a temporary measurement form must be obtained annually. Such forms remain valid for the calendar year. Blank measurement forms can be obtained from the Competition Office.
- d. A pony 8 years old or older must have a permanent measurement card.

19. Schooling

- a. In the Hunter Divisions, all over fences divisions will offer an Open Schooling Card, **one per horse each day**. Please indicate on the entry form. No placings or ribbons.
- b. For Jumper Divisions, no schooling rounds are offered.
- c. For horses and ponies schooling on Tuesday August 20 prior to the competition, the fee is \$20 per horse or pony.

20. General Information and Grounds Rules

- a. Trucks and trailers must be parked in designated parking areas. Trailers are allowed in the stabling areas only to load or off-load. Directions of grounds staff must be respected.
- b. Camper hook-ups are not available.
- c. All parking must be in designated parking area as per posted signs. PARKING IN BARN AREAS IS LIMITED. **Fire lanes must remain clear. Vehicles may be towed at owner's expense.**
- d. Damage: all owners and participants are responsible for any damage incurred by them, their agents or employees, to stalls, buildings, and other property on the competition grounds, and shall be billed accordingly.
- e. A disaster plan is in place, as per EC requirements, and available for inspection in the Competition Office.

21. Dogs

All non-Coveside dogs (we know who they are) MUST be kept on a leash at all times while on the property. Unruly or noisy dogs may be asked to leave. There will be a \$100

fee for any disruption to competition caused by a loose dog. Owners must pick up and properly dispose of their dog's excrement. DO NOT LEAVE A DOG IN A CAR.

22. Hunter Classic and Pony Classic

Pony Hunters and Hunters must have entered and competed in a division in order to be eligible to enter the Pony Classic or Hunter Classic and must be entered in the respective Classic prior to the first class in which the pony or horse competes.

23. Jumper Nomination Fee

Jumpers must pay the applicable nomination fee unless competing in a division or class that does not require nomination. Nomination fee is non-refundable. Jumpers must enter and compete in at least one other class in a division in order to enter a Mini Prix or Grand Prix.

24. Golf carts/motorized vehicles

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license in the jurisdiction in which they reside may not operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The individual who signs an entry as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule is solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from the operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the minor. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. All motorized vehicles must be operated responsibly and slowly with regard for the presence of horses and pedestrians. All motorized vehicles are to be used for the purposes of rider transportation related to competition activities are not for recreation. **Competition management has the right to prohibit use of overly large, noisy or irresponsibly driven vehicles.**

24. Handsfree Devices

Earphones and/or other electronic communication devices are strictly prohibited in all EC/FEI Competitions, and such usage is penalized by elimination. The use of one earbud/earphone is allowed while mounted except in the competition rings.

25. Insurance

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to a third party caused by themselves, their employees, agents or their horses. They are strongly

advised to hold third party insurance to cover activities at equestrian events.

26. Vet and Farrier

The official competition vet and farrier phone numbers are posted in the Competition Office and in Stabling Areas. All owners and participants are responsible for any bills for requested vet and farrier services. Any person not meeting this obligation may be deemed to be not in good standing and may be denied entry at future competitions.

27. Hospitality

Canteens are available on site on all competition days.

28. Photography

The Organizing committee and sponsors reserves the right to use competitor photographs in promotional material and on social media unless another arrangement is made in writing with the Organizing Committee. The Coveseide Classic official photographer is Horsepower Photography (Mark MacDonald). No other commercial photography is permitted on the grounds.

29. All questions not addressed in these rules should be directed to a member of the Organizing Committee. Use the contact form at www.covesidestables.com to send your questions.

30. Management

Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions regarding or arising out of the competition without claims, damages or recourse of any kind. For all questions not covered in these rules, horse show management shall decide regulations, and management's decision is final. Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit claim damages, change any course, cancel or combine any unfilled classes, reschedule classes (after due notice to exhibitors), change rings or rotate judges, and to change specifications in jumper classes at any time.

31. Microchip

Beginning December 1, 2018 all horses competing in USEF licenced shows will be required to be microchipped. Microchip number will need to be reported to the United States Equestrian Federation.

32. Smoking

Smoking or vaping is not allowed within 6 meters of any barn or building.

33. Biosecurity

BioSecurity is everyone's responsibility! Coveseide is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all participants and their horses. All participants are requested to practice good disease prevention practices. Travelling and competing horses are at an increased risk for contracting and spreading contagious diseases. South Shore Veterinary Clinic is the official Coveseide Classic veterinarian. All horses entering the grounds must not

have been in contact with any sick horses within the last 15 days. They must not exhibit any sign of illness. Any horse that has been sick or exposed to an infectious disease within the last 15 days must have their attending veterinarian contact the competition veterinarian prior to entry to the show grounds. All horses are required to be verifiably current on Influenza and EHV 1-4 vaccines (within 6 months). All horses while on the competition grounds are expected to have their temperatures taken and recorded on a daily basis during the show. Please have temperature records available upon request. We require that any horse with a rectal temperature above 38.5 C (101.8 F) report to show management and/or the show veterinarian immediately. The show veterinarian will examine any horses with an elevated temperature or other signs of illness prior to being allowed to show. Failure to comply may result in your horses being required to enter our quarantine isolation barn or leave the show grounds. Any horse identified to have or is suspected of having a contagious disease will be removed to the isolation area. It is advised that all competitors have a contingency plan in the event that a sick horse in their care needs to be removed from the show grounds. We require that braiders/grooms/riders use the hand sanitizers, provided in the stall areas after handling any horse. Please avoid any direct or indirect contact between horses, in particular nose to nose contact and use of any common feed/ drinking buckets. The early detection of any contagious disease is the key to prevention of a disease outbreak. Following these simple requirements will be a major step in the prevention of the spread of disease. We appreciate your cooperation and look forward to everyone having a successful horse show experience.

34. Equine Vaccinations

Pursuant to EC Rule A519 (effective June 9, 2019), It is strongly recommended that all equines at EC sanctioned competitions or events be accompanied by proof that Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations have been administered at a maximum of 12-month intervals. However, horses competing in competitions should have received a booster for Equine Influenza and for Equine Herpes Virus within 6 months +21 days before arrival at the event. No horse should receive vaccination within 7 days of arrival of the competition. The frequency of vaccine administration should be as recommended by the vaccine manufacturer or veterinarian. It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. Documentation should consist of one of the following:

a. In the case of vaccines given by a veterinarian, the Person Responsible, upon request by Competition

Management, should provide documentation from the Veterinarian, documenting that the equine in question received the vaccinations on the date administered and the name of the vaccine.

b. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the Person Responsible, upon request by Competition Management, should provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the Person Responsible, the equine's name, the serial number and expiration date of the vaccine and the date of administration.

c. In the case of an equine that is unable to receive either of the vaccines due to a history of adverse reactions, the Person Responsible, upon request by Competition Management, should provide a letter from a veterinarian on official letterhead stating the equine cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of the equine's temperature taken at least twice daily for the seven days prior to arrival at the competition grounds. These equines should also have their temperatures taken and recorded twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures taken should be provided to the Competition Management, Steward, Official Veterinarian or Technical Delegate when requested.

It is intended that vaccination requirement compliance will be universally enforced for all equines entering Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions beginning in 2020.

It is the intent of Coveside Stables to offer a safe and healthy competition environment for all exhibitors and their horses.

HUNTER SPECIFICATIONS

Please read carefully to ensure you are eligible for your selected divisions and classes.

EC Pre Green & Green Working Hunters

Pre Green Hunter: A horse of any age in its first or second year of showing over fences in classes 3'0 or higher at EC Sanctioned Competitions. First Year Pre Green horses will jump 3'. Second Year Pre Green horses will jump 3'3. Cross entry is not permitted into any class with fences at 3'6 or higher. Art G303.

Combined Working Hunters: First Year Green Working Hunter 3'6, Second Year Green Hunter 3'9, and Regular Working Hunter 4'. A horse in its first year of showing over fences at 3'6 or higher must be shown as a first year green horse. A horse in its second year of showing over fences 3'6 or higher must be shown as a second year green horse. Any horse may show in the regular hunter 4'. A horse's green status is considered to be broken once it competes over fences at 3'6 or higher.

USEF Conformation, Green & Young Hunters
Conformation Hunters: All conformation sections are to be judged 70% performance, 30% conformation. Green Conformation - 3'6, High Performance Conformation - 3'9.

Green Hunters: (USEF HU130) Hunter eligibility begins when a horse of any age, competes for the first time in any over fences class with jumps at 3'0 or higher in any Hunter or Equitation class held at a Federation or Equine Canada competition in North America. A horse may compete in only one Green Hunter section at any one competition.

Green Hunter 3'0 & 3'3: Horse may jump 3'0 or 3'3 for two competition years (not necessarily consecutive). Green Hunter 3'0 may not cross enter Hunter, Equitation or Jumper classes over 3'3. Green Hunter 3'3 may compete at 3'6 max 4 times prior to August 1st to remain eligible for that division and may not cross enter jumper classes above 3'3.

Green Hunter 3'6: Horse will be required to compete in the Green Hunter 3'6 once it has shown in a hunter or equitation class at 3'6 or

higher a fifth time in one competition year and may not compete in jumper classes over 3'6.

Green Hunter 3'9: May not compete in jumper classes over 3'9. A horse may show Green 3'6 for one year and 3'9 Green Hunter for one year. Green Hunters will jog for soundness.

Amateur Owner & Junior Hunters 3'3 & 3'6

Amateur Owner Divisions 3'3 & 3'6: To be ridden by amateur owners or an amateur member of the owner's family. In either case, classes are restricted to riders who are no longer eligible to compete as junior exhibitors. Leased horses are not eligible and multiple ownership is not permitted unless all owners are of the same family. Amateur owner divisions will be combined with other amateur owner or junior hunter divisions if less than six entries. Amateur Owner 18 to 35 Hunters 3'6 and 3'3, Amateur Owner 36 & Over Hunters 3'6 and 3'3. Amateur Owner Hunter 3'3 riders and/or horses may not cross enter into the Adult 3' hunters. They may cross enter into the Adult Equitation. A/O 3'3 horses may not cross enter into the A/O 3'6.



Junior Hunter: Riders must not have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the previous calendar year for USEF and Jan 1st for EC. Junior Hunter divisions are as follows and will be combined if less than 6 entries; Junior Hunter Younger (15 and under) 3'6, Older (16-17) 3'6, Riders may not ride more than 2 horses in each 3'6 section. Riders/horses may not cross enter into Children's Hunters from the 3'6 section.

High Performance & Performance Working Hunters

Open to horses of any age and not restricted by any previous show records. Individual classes may be entered. Divisions offered; High Performance Working Hunter 4'0, Performance Working Hunter 3'6, Performance Working Hunter 3'3.



Pony Hunters | Respective Heights

Open to ponies ridden by junior riders subject to the following restrictions: Junior "A" riders may ride large ponies only, Junior "B" and Junior "C" riders may ride ponies of all heights, Large ponies exceed 13.2 hands but do not exceed 14.2 hands, Medium ponies exceed 12.2 hands but do not exceed 13.2 hands, Small ponies do not exceed 12.2 hands. Ponies entered in the Rated Pony Hunter divisions are required to hold a valid EC measurement card or be measured by an official. To compete in classes restricted to ponies, foreign ponies must also have an EC measurement card. Sign up times for measurements are reserved through the competition office. Pony divisions with less than 6 entries will be combined. Adults are permitted to show (be judged on) large ponies in miscellaneous non-point classes not limited to juniors and adult amateurs may ride large ponies in adult amateur classes where fences do not exceed 3'. A pony judged with an adult may not be judged in any rated pony divisions with a junior at the same competition. Juniors of any age may show ponies of any height in miscellaneous non-point classes.

Adult Amateur Hunter/Non-Pro 1 3'0

Horses or riders entered in adult amateur hunter sections may not compete in any

amateur owner 3'6 or 3'3 section at the same competition. Riders entered in adult amateur hunter sections may not compete in any other hunter class in which obstacles exceed 3'3 or jumper class in which obstacles exceed 1.0m at the same competition. Adult Amateur/Non Pro 1 Hunters are offered in the following sections: Adult Amateur/Non Pro 1 Hunter 18-35, Adult Amateur/Non Pro 1 Hunter 36+.



Adult Amateur Equitation 3'0

Open to amateur riders who may not compete in any class where the fence height exceeds 3'3 in the hunter ring or 1.0m in the jumper ring.

Children's Hunter 3'0"

Riders entered in Children's Hunter sections may not compete in any other hunter class where fences exceed 3'3" or jumper classes where fences exceed 1.0m at the same competition. Horses and/or riders entered in Children's Hunter classes may not cross enter into any Junior Hunter section at the same competition. 


